GWWO Architects Promotes Terry Squyres and Eric Feiss

Terry Squyres joined GWWO in 1997 and became a member of the management team in 1998. She served on the Board of the National Council on Qualifications for Lighting Professionals and has been a juror for the International Interior Design Association's Lighting Design Awards. Terry is a registered architect in Maryland and Pennsylvania and is a LEED Accredited Professional recognized by the US Green Building Council. She holds a Bachelor of Architecture degree from the University of Notre Dame.
